, being first duly sworn, says:

- I am a Child Support Officer assigned to this matter by the Anoka County Human Services Division, Office of Child Support, and have access to all agency files and records of the Anoka County Human Services Division, the Minnesota Child Support computer system (PRISM), Minnesota Care computer system (MMIS), and Minnesota Department of Human Services public assistance computer system (MAXIS). This Affidavit is based upon my review of those records, my personal knowledge of this matter, or, where indicated, upon information and belief.
- This Affidavit is prepared for the county's motion to sequester funds that will be distributed to NCP to pay child support and child support arrears and/or judgments. There is a court hearing scheduled for ______, at 8:30 a.m., at the Anoka County Courthouse, 325 East Main Street, Anoka, MN 55303.
- 3. To the best of my knowledge, the following documents reflect the most accurate and current information available to the Office of Child Support in the above case, and are attached and incorporated by reference:
 - Department of Employment and Economic Development Wage Summary
 - Case Information Sheet (CIS)
- 4. NCP and CP were married on
- 5. NCP and CP are the parents of:

, born , born

6. By its Judgment and Decree dated , the Anoka County District Court dissolved the marriage of the parties and required NCP to pay ongoing basic support of \$ per month beginning , required CP to maintain medical, health and hospitalization insurance for the benefit of the minor children as long as such coverage is available through her

employment. In addition, the Court ordered NCP to pay one half of the cost of dependent medical and dental care coverage and ordered the parties equally liable for any medical, dental, orthodontia, eye care or other health costs for the minor children not covered by insurance. The Court ordered NCP to pay child care support of \$ per month beginning .

- 7. As a result of cost-of-living adjustments, the latest being effective May 1, , the basic child support obligation has increased to \$ per month.
- 8. NCP current portion of the children's dependent medical and dental coverage is \$ per month.
- 9. NCP's child support obligation totals \$ per month.
- 10. According to MAXIS data, the following form(s) of public assistance are currently being expended on behalf of CP and child(ren):
 - a. The State of Minnesota is not currently expending public assistance on behalf of CP and child(ren).
- 11. According to MAXIS data, the State of Minnesota is not currently expending public assistance in the form of MFIP, General Assistance (GA), General Assistance Medical Care (GAMC), Medical Assistance, Minnesota Care, or Child Care Assistance on behalf of NCP.
- 12. NCP is also required to pay current child support in the amount of \$ per month toward support for the child, , born in . The order that initially established the child support obligation is dated . Anoka County is maintaining this case.
- 13. NCP is also required to pay toward an arrears only case maintained by Hennepin County for the emancipated child , born in . The monthly nonaccrual is \$ and the past due balance is \$.
- 14. The Office of Child Support does not have any information regarding NCP's income, employment or availability of medical and dental insurance available through an employer or union. Automatic Income Withholding is not in place.
- 15. NCP is an heir to the estate of NCP. There is a current probate file opened in Anoka County District Court, Estate of NCP, Case Number . NCP is a devisee and heir under the estate. There appears to be significant assets within the estate. The Application for Informal Probate of Will and for Informal Appointment of Personal Representative dated , estimates probate and non-probate assets totaling approximately \$235,000.00 with \$70,000.00 of indebtedness.
- 16. The last date to file a claim upon the estate is April 30, 2009.
- 17. NCP has a history of non-payment of his support obligations. NCP has not made a support payment through the Minnesota Child Support Payment Center since May 22, 2006.
- 18. In attempts to collect child support, the Office of Child Support has sent NCP non-payment notices, notices of credit bureau reporting, project intercept and revenue recapture. The public authority has attempted to serve an Order to Show Cause on NCP to have him appear before the court and explain why he has failed to pay his child support as court-

ordered. However, the public authority has been unable to personally serve NCP with the legal documents. NCP is mailed monthly billing statements.

- 19. On March 20, 2005, the Office of Child Support forwarded notification to suspend NCP's driver's license to the Department of Public Safety. A hold remains on NCP's driver's license for the non-payment of his support obligations.
- 20. NCP owes child support arrears on this case totaling \$ to CP through February 28, 2009.
- 21. Based upon the anticipated date of the child's emancipation, child support, medical support, and spousal maintenance would accrue for at least an additional 63 months from April 1, 2009, through June 30, 2014, for a total due of \$114,402.89, using a 2% cost of living adjustment every two years, namely May 2011 and May 2013. Said amounts are calculated as follows:

The total estimated future child support is calculated by adding the month of April 2009, (\$1,685.79), plus May 2009 through April 2011 (24 months x \$1,788.79 = \$42,930.96), plus May 2011 through April 2013 (24 months x \$1,823.45 = \$43,762.80), plus May 2013 through June 2014 (14 months x \$1,858.81 = \$26,023.34), for a total of \$114,402.89.
