Eligibility Criteria

- Hennepin County, Minnesota residents
- Offenses must occur in Hennepin County
- The offender must be 18 years of age or over
- The offender must be charged with an offense as listed in "Target Population"
- The offender must have served in the United States Armed Forces
- Not determined by VA eligibility
- The client has a treatable behavioral issue

Orientation Phase- Conditional Release	30 days
Treatment Plan Development	90 days
On-Going Treatment Plan	120 days
Stabilization	120 days
Transition to Graduation	30 – 180 days

- Have at least six months of current, continuous sobriety.
- Complete treatment and aftercare outlined in treatment plan.
- Complete 30 hours of community service.
